Billy our burns boy is now a big energetic six year old in Upstate New York. He has been adopted by a big hearted Mum who took him in when he came over for medical treatment. His siblings are wonderful with him.

Two Starving Children rescued. At the end of April in a large sugar cane village called Kikira we had a small boy named Joel about 12 months old brought to us with a request for help. Out in the village while we were preparing the legal documents for his admission his Grandmother ran off with him. We knew this little boy did not have long to live without care. We found them at the local Children's Hospital. The hospital struggles to care for the children so it was arranged for his admission to Welcome Home with the Grandma's and Mothers blessing.

While at the hospital we saw **Susan** (2 1/2 years old) who was struggling to stay alive. She was in a desperate state. We worked with the parents, doctors and the village chair to get permission to send her as a Welcome Home Child to International Hospital in Kampala for two weeks. She is now back at Welcome Home (she had visited for 5 minutes before Kampala) having the life all children deserve. With the good nutrition, medical care and love she is now starting a new life.
